THE EPISTLE OF PAUL THE APOSTLE TO THE  
**Hebrews**

... who at sundry times and in divers  
manners speak in these parts unto the  
by the prophets,  
in these last days spoken unto us by  
whom he hath appointed him of old  
by whom also he made the worlds;  
being the brightness of his glory, and  
the image of his person, and upholding  
all things by the word of his power, when  
he hath purged our sins, sat down  
at the right hand of the Majesty on high;  
and he hath by inheritance obtained a  
more name than they.  
To which of the angels said he at  
any time, Sit down on my right hand,  
or on my left hand, till I make  
mine enemies thy footstool?  
And now he hath obtained a more  
name than the angels, who was made a little  
lower than the angels for the suffering of  
death, crowned with glory and honour; that  
he by the grace of God should taste death for  
every man.  
For it became him, for whom are all  
things, and by whom are all things, in bring-  
ing many sons unto glory, to make the cap-  
tivity of their subjection perfect through  
his death.  
For both he that sacrificed and  
they who are sacrificed are all of one; for  
which cause he is not ashamed to call them  
brethren.  
Saying, I will declare thy name unto my  
brethren, in the midst of the church will I  
sing praise unto thee.  
And again, I will put my trust in  
God, even thy God, hath  
not ashamed to call them  
brethren.  
At the beginning hast  
thou said of the earth: and the  
worlds were of thee made:  
but thou remainest  
the same, and thy years  
shall not fail thee.  
Thou hast purged  
our sins, and thou  
sittest at the right  
hand of the Majesty

L: Dear Friends, All means  
all- no one is excluded from  
this feast!

L: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

L: Lift up your hearts.

C: We lift them up to the  
Lord.

L: Let us give thanks to the  
Lord our God.

C: It is right to give our  
**thanks and praise**

L: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

God of Abraham and Sarah,  
God of Miriam and Moses,  
God of Joshua and Deborah,  
God of Ruth and David,

God of the priests and the  
prophets,  
God of Mary and Joseph,  
God of the apostles  
and the martyrs,

God of our mothers  
and our fathers,  
God of our children to all  
generations.

L: And so, with your people  
on earth and all the  
company of heaven,  
we praise your name and  
join their unending hymn:

**C: Holy, holy, holy Lord,  
God of power and might,  
heaven and earth are full of  
your glory.**

**Hosanna in the highest.**

**C: Blessed is he who comes  
in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

L: Holy are you, and  
blessed is your Son Jesus  
Christ. By the baptism of his  
suffering, death, and  
resurrection you gave birth  
to your Church,

L: delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

L: On the night in which he  
gave himself up for us,  
he took bread, gave thanks  
to you, broke the bread,  
gave it to his disciples, and  
said:

L: "Take, eat;  
this is my body which is  
given for you.  
Do this in remembrance of  
me."

L: When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said:

L: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

L: "Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

L: And so, in remembrance  
of these your mighty acts in  
Jesus Christ, we offer  
ourselves in praise and  
thanksgiving as a holy and  
living sacrifice,

L: in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

**Christ has died;  
Christ is risen;  
Christ will come again.**

L: Pour out your Holy Spirit  
on us gathered here, and on  
these gifts of bread and  
wine.

L: Make them be for us  
the body and blood of Christ,  
that we may be for the world  
the body of Christ,  
redeemed by his blood.


L: Renew our communion
